

## Time to make reservations for Bounty-Pitcairn Conference 2012 in August

There have been exciting developments in plans for the Bounty-Pitcairn Conference 2012, set for Sunday, August 19 through Tuesday, August 21, 2012 at the Pitcairn Islands Study Center on the campus of Pacific Union College in California's beautiful Napa Valley.

#### **Rare Native Cloth**

Several pieces of rare, decorated, laboriously handcrafted, Polynesian-style tapa cloth, produced by Pitcairn Islander Meralda Warren and Pitcairn children, will be displayed and offered for sale at the conference. Warren, one of seven winners of Commonwealth Connections International Arts Residencies in 2011, rediscovered the ancient art of tapa making on Pitcairn. A technique originally brought to the island by the Tahitians who accompanied the Bounty mutineers, it was lost by the middle of the 20th century. Through trial and error, Ms. Warren was able to exactly reconstruct the methods used for making tapa cloth on the island in ancient times.

#### The Pitcairn Log DVD

A DVD containing digital copies of the entire run of the Pitcairn Log, the journal of the Pitcairn Islands Study Group, since its September 1973 inception, will be offered for sale for the first time at the conference. The DVD, which will include search software as well as some of the group's out-of-print monographs, is expected to hold over 3,000 pages of interesting and important Pitcairn Island and Bounty Saga stories, maps, illustrated philately, and Pitcairner-written letters.

#### **Documentary Film Premiere**

The first-time-ever public showing of the documentary film, "Dem Tul Pitcairn," is scheduled for August 20, 2012. It is anticipated that this will be the most complete telling of the Bounty-Pitcairn story ever filmed. Its producers have traveled thousands of miles to numerous locations to bring accuracy and great interest to the story.

#### Video Talks with Pitcairn

Two live question-and-answer video chat periods will be conducted with Pitcairn Island via the Internet on both August 20 and 21. Attendees in Angwin will have their questions answered during these sessions face-to-face.

#### **Pitcairn Crafts Market**

A Pitcairn handicrafts and curios market will also be held at scheduled times during the conference. The items, all of which will be offered for sale, will have been crafted on Pitcairn Island and then shipped to conference organizers within a short period of time before the conference commences. Unusually attractive bargains are to be had among the many crafts and curios that will be found.

#### **Study Center Tours**

Small group tours of the extensive resources available at the Pitcairn Islands Study Center will be offered several times during the conference. Attendees will have an opportunity to peruse the Center's 1,500-book library which constitutes one of the world's largest collections relating to the Mutiny on the Bounty, Captain William Bligh, HMAV *Bounty*, and both Pitcairn and Norfolk Islands. Additionally, models of the *Bounty* and Pitcairn may be viewed in the center, along with Pitcairn handicrafts; small relics from the *Bounty*; Pitcairn and Norfolk philately; thousands of pages of information about The Bounty Saga; *Bounty* and Pitcairn paintings; and many videos and DVDs relating to The Bounty Saga.

#### **Talk with Pitcairners**

Highlighting the conference will be the presence of two people who currently live on Pitcairn Island, two who grew up on Pitcairn, and a former commissioner of the island. Commitments to speak have been received by 13 individuals, including: Pitcairn Islanders Jacqui Christian and Kari Boye Young; Marie Christian Thomas, whose birth and early years were on Pitcairn; former Commissioner for the Pitcairn Islands Leslie Jaques; British author Glynn Christian; Australian numismatist Ron Edwards; marine conservation advocate Heather Bradner; philatelist and former PISG President Mark Butterline; author and Pitcairn Islands Study Center Director Dr. Herbert Ford; professor and author Dr. Bob Kirk; communicator and author Donald A. Maxton; author and former Pitcairn Log Managing Editor Steve Pendleton; and maritime, Bounty and Pitcairn collector Tony Probst.

#### **Conference Accommodations**

As of late October, 18 Pacific Union College dormi-

tory rooms with shared shower and toilet were still available for up to three nights (in August 19, out August 22) at a cost of \$78 per night per double or single.
